BUYER BEWARE!

When purchasing cattle please ask the vendor if you can see the Pedigree Certificate of the animal you are buying. Whilst an animal may be 'pure-bred' if it is by, and out of, a pure-bred Longhorn it may not be on the Longhorn registry. You may incur extra cost to register the animal yourself or it may not be able to be registered at all and will therefore be of lesser value.

If you have any doubts then please check with the office and I can advise you in confidence of the animal's status. Alternatively log on to the website, go to 'herdbook' and look up the animal's details from there.

Any very young calves sold at foot that are not birth notified or registered at the time of sale will, when registered by the new owner, carry the prefix of the owner of the dam at the time of calving. Whilst calves do not have to be registered or birth notified until they are three months old it is recommended that vendors notify or register calves before they are sold.

Bluetongue Virus Update

The first batches of BTV8 vaccine from Intervet will start to arrive in mid May and all farmers in the English Protection Zone are strongly encouraged to contact their local vets and place orders based on the number of animals standing on the farm for vaccination. The sooner animals are vaccinated the sooner they will have immunity for this serious disease.

Do not be complacent with making the decision to vaccinate, farmers that had positive animals last year are experiencing huge calf losses this year and although vaccinating animals during the summer is fraught with hassles, the consequences of not vaccinating livestock are horrendous. On top of this, if livestock are not vaccinated, there is a much greater chance of midges spreading the virus further and the industry will never get on top of the disease.

So please take this disease seriously and vaccinate because production losses are huge and we must all make a concerted effort to dampen down infection.

The Scottish Government are expected to clarify its position on placing an order for BTV8 vaccine soon. Earlier this month it had said it would make sure there was enough vaccine available to protect Scottish farmers should BTV8 enter the country this summer – while making clear its preference for the introduction of a national vaccination programme this winter ahead of an explosion in the disease over 2009. However it would now appear that there are funding issues to consider over the imminent ordering of vaccine to be available, if necessary, this summer and also a realisation that because Scotland has delayed its vaccine order it could find itself at the back of a long delivery queue and at the mercy of manufacturing companies delivering the vaccine as the market develops.

The Welsh Assembly has responded to the NBA's suggestion to develop a vaccine plan and order more BTV8 vaccine for use in Wales this summer with the following observations. It notes that 2.5 million does have already been ordered (from Defra) for use in Wales this summer and the figures is based on the number of susceptible animals in Monmouthshire and Powys.

Also (like the Scottish government) that the availability of additional vaccine will depend on how much can be delivered by suppliers who have to take account of orders placed by other affected countries in Europe, and that European legislation only allows vaccination in a Protection Zone The availability of more vaccine in Wales this summer will be determined by the developing disease situation and is subject to expert veterinary advice.

However the Welsh Assembly Government (WAG) has agreed with stakeholders that vaccination will be on a voluntary basis. It says a compulsory vaccination programme is more expensive for both the farmer and government because it would require an enforcement programme undertaken by Animal Health which could increase costs by 50%.

Bluetongue Virus Update

The Welsh Assembly has also said that although the European Commission has said there would be some co-funding of vaccination programmes further investigation has established that the funds would not be significant, that the administration of the refund could prove more costly for farmers and government than if they went ahead themselves, and payment would also be retrospective.

A Blue Tongue Protection Zone can only be put in place as a result of confirmed circulating disease. If England extends the size of their PZ's, as is their intention and they reach the borders of Wales, then Wales can consider whether to extend the PZ into Wales. If it was determined to extend the PZ this would facilitate the use of vaccine in Wales. The trigger for the use of vaccine would be based on circumstances, in light of veterinary opinion and epidemiological advice. In the event of confirmed disease in Wales the size of the PZ and SZ would need to be considered in the light of the circumstances, particularly the location and taking vaccination into account. WAG is in discussions with vaccine suppliers and Defra about the possibility of further vaccine supplies.

Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. The NBA NI and stakeholders are in discussions with DARDNI on whether to place an order for BTV8 vaccine soon. NBA NI believes the time is right to order vaccine now so that it is available if needed this summer and will be discussing a potential vaccine plan for the Northern Ireland livestock sector over the next couple of weeks.
