

## **CATTLE HEALTH**

#### CATTLE NEMATODES

Most cattle will still be housed in March and the major endoparasite risks are type 2 ostertagiasis, untreated liver fluke and lungworm in youngstock not adequately dosed at housing or in less susceptible groups not usually given a housing dose; for example, adults. The risk of type 2 ostertagiasis may be relatively low this year, as high-incidence years tend to follow dry summers.

Plans need to be put in place for parasite control during the coming grazing season as part of a veterinary health plan taking into account the type and age of stock, and the history of the available pasture. Vaccination (Huskvac) is often the best way to control lungworm in dairy replacements, and in suckler herds with a history of disease. Animals over two months old require two doses four weeks apart, ideally finishing two weeks before turnout or weaning

### **BEEF EXPO**

## NATIONAL SPRING SPECTACULAR SHOW AT NATIONAL BEEF ASSOCIATION, BEEF EXPO 2010

April 9 is the closing date for entries for the National Spring Spectacular Show of beef cattle to be held as part of the UK's national beef event, Beef Expo 2010, at Hexham Auction Mart on Thursday, May 27.

Lloyds TSB Agriculture has been confirmed for the third year running as major sponsor of the event which is organised by the National Beef Association.

The National Spring Spectacular Show is open to commercial beef cattle by both continental and native breed sires with a total prize pool of over £5000. The 20 classes, to be judged by Archie MacGregor, Glasgow, will include sections for baby calves up to 425kg (steers) and 400kg (heifers) and steers and heifers by native breed, Limousin, British Blue, Charolais and other continental breed sires.

The championship awards, sponsored by Crystalyx, will include a top prize of  $\pounds500$  for the supreme champion and  $\pounds250$  for the reserve and  $\pounds200$  each for the baby beef, steer and heifer champions. Class prize money will start at  $\pounds50$  for first prize down to  $\pounds5$  for sixth place.

In addition, two classes for young handlers – 16 years of age and under and 17 to 21 years of age – will be judged by Mr MacGregor's wife, Libby.

"The show at last year's Beef Expo was a great success and is now well established as a major annual event for the beef cattle industry and a popular added attraction for Beef Expo," said organiser, Euan Emslie.

Cattle entered for the show are required to be delivered to Hexham Auction Mart between 10.00am and 4.00pm on Wednesday, May 26. Judging will commence at 9.00am the following morning.

The entry fee for NBA members is  $\pounds 10 + VAT$  and for non-members  $\pounds 20 + VAT$ .

## HERD PROFILE

Adrian Bytom of Coopers Hill Farm, Alvechurch, Worcestershire, submitted this article to explain how he uses Longhorn cattle for grazing projects under the 'Newgap' (North East Worcestershire Grazing Animal Project) scheme....

'We employ 'old girls' along with some youngstock Longhorns that we have purchased, had donated and bred along the way to service the requirements that 'beasts do best'.... eat the herbage! The herd is made up from Longhorns that have been sourced from breeders, by private sales or at one of the Society sales, some of which no longer fulfil the herd requirements or have been retired from breeding. Some of these former owners have a strong desire to see the animals lead a full life and not face a premature end via the slaughterhouse or rendering plant. To this end we do our best to comply with their wishes and it is only when animal welfare is beyond our remit that we let the stock go.

The herds range in size from lots of two to 20 in number and we operate an extensive system across wildlife sites, nature reserves and urban fringe agricultural land for many clients. The cattle have plenty of acres each, do not get fed at the gate with cake and have access to hav (made on some of the more suitable sites) when conditions require; needless to say we have used an awful lot of fodder this year but as they say "hay in the barn is better than money in the bank", even if our Winter proceeds into May they will not go hungry!

The sites all have regular "Lookers" either in a voluntary capacity or with Newgap staff; this is deemed essential for the welfare of the cattle as different project areas are subject to site specific issues...... not always detrimental!

Newgap are occasionally asked what areas do they operate and my response has been the counties of Worcestershire and Warwickshire, however, if fellow Longhorn herds have a desire to be involved in this project I would be able to offer my response to perhaps "nationwide". If interested then I will compile a list or network for future prospects'.

#### Herdbook 2009

The 2009 Herdbook will go to print in early April so any cattle that were born before 1 January 2010 need registering or birth notifying ASAP to ensure their inclusion in the Herdbook.

#### Showing unregistered bulls

There were a number of unregistered bulls shown in Longhorn classes last year. All cattle entered into Longhorn classes must be registered with the Society. In the case of bulls there was anomaly between the show rules and the bull registration rules, so these have now been amended thus:

Bulls that are proposed to be kept for breeding must be inspected by a practising veterinary surgeon prior to registration. Application for a registration form should reach the Society office when the animal is between 365 and 800 days of age, or if the bull has reached the minimum weight of 431kg before it is 365 days old then registration may be applied for at that time. It must be inspected by 800 days of age and must have reached a minimum adjusted weight of 431 kg. (950 lbs.) at 400 days, with 1kg per day adjustment for bulls over 400 days up to 631 kg. at 600 days, and 0.5kg per day adjustment for bulls between 600 and 800 days of age up to 731kg at 800 days. All bulls must adhere to the breed standards.

## **BEEF PRODUCTION WORKSHOP**

More and more Longhorn members are producing beef to sell via various outlets. In response to requests we are organising a Beef Production Workshop to be held at Charles Sutcliffe's farm at Tetford, Horncastle, Lincolnshire and at Meridian Meats, Louth, Lincolnshire. The Workshop is to be held over the weekend of Saturday 3 and Sunday 4 July with a Longhorn beef supper on Saturday evening.

On Saturday afternoon Martin Brown, MD of L. Brown & Son (Wholesale Butchers) Ltd. of Lincoln's City Abattoir, will demonstrate how he selects cattle to purchase for his business. Martin will use cattle from the Tetford herd for his demonstration. (Weather and time permitting it will additionally be possible to see other cattle out at grass near home if members are interested.)

On Sunday morning Jim Sutcliffe, BBC Young Butcher of the Year in 2009, will break down a Longhorn carcase in the cutting room at Meridian Meats shop in Louth. Jim hopes to demonstrate the strengths and weaknesses of the carcase and suggest what improvements might be worth considering for the future.

The weekend will finish with an optional lunch before we all depart.

Saturday evening and Sunday lunch will be at venues that are supplied by Meridian Meats and will feature Longhorn beef. Suggestions for overnight accommodation in or near Louth will be available when you book.

In order for everyone to gain the most out of the weekend numbers will be limited to 30 so please book you place in plenty of time. If you are interested in attending please email or phone Debbie, or complete and return the booking form opposite.

Below are Charles' thoughts behind some of the themes to be explored over the two days.

Nobody would disagree that over the past 20-25 years the Longhorn has been improved by selective breeding probably more than at any time since Robert Bakewell selectively bred the "improved Longhorn" in the late eighteenth century.

An eye to the show ring has been the motivation almost exclusively in the present day improvements whereas Bakewell concentrated on meat

production and by the time he had finished his cattle were fat and meaty and suitable for the market of that era.

The Longhorn is now a mainstream breed and, on the whole, is doing a great job producing quality beef for a discerning "niche" market. But how does today's Longhorn match up to what the trade buyers look for when selecting cattle to purchase? We all know that our breed can produce beef of unrivalled taste, texture and succulence but how does it shape up in terms of wastage at the boning out stage? Have breeders moved on from viewing beef production as a by-product of pedigree breeding rather than their prime objective of breeding beef cattle? How much influence does diet, stress free rearing, age at slaughter, hanging time have on the quality of the end product? Can pedigree breeding and meat production lie together in comfort?
