The winner of this year's Maydencroft Award for the most points gained on the show circuit in 2007 was Mr & Mrs J W Stanley's Blackbrook Philosopher with 17 points. He had wins at East of England, Newark & Notts, Rutland and the Royal Show, and was Breed Champion at both the East of England and Newark & Notts .

In second place with 13 points was Mr & Mrs B&M Llewellyn's Carreg Gunner who had a great season taking first place and Breed Champion at Shropshire and West Midlands and placings at the Royal Show and Bath & West.

In third place with 12 points was Mr & Mrs D & A Blockley's Southfield Gangster who had wins at the Royal Show and the Great Yorkshire.

The Maydencroft Award was presented by last year's winner Mr John Brigg to Mrs Pat Stanley. There had been 33 eligible bulls shown during the year

Leebarn Perpetual Trophy

A new Trophy has been presented to the Society by Mr Roger Carter to mark the end of his term as President. The Leebarn Perpetual Trophy was awarded to the cow gaining the most points on the show circuit in 2007. The winner with 16 points was Mrs Sarah Coleman's Chalkney Image. Image had won at Kent, Royal Norfolk and Suffolk and had been Breed Champion at Suffolk.

In second place with 14 points was Mrs N Luckett's Wellhead Dorcas who had had wins at Royal Highland and Northumberland and was placed at the Great Yorkshire. She had been Reserve Breed Champion at Northumberland and was Breed Champion at Royal Highland

In third place also with 14 points but having less Championship points than Wellhead Dorcas was Mr P Close's Linton Dynwen. She had won and been Reserve Breed Champion at the Great Yorkshire and had also been placed at Northumberland and the Royal Show.

The Leebarn Perpetual Trophy was presented by Mr R Carter to Miss C Coleman. There had been 36 cows shown this year

President's Award

The President's Award for outstanding contribution to the breed was awarded by outgoing President Mr Roger Carter to Mr Peter Guest. The President said that Peter had done a lot for the breed, organising sales and running the Mid West Breeder's Group and much of what he did was behind the scenes, so this award was to recognise his efforts and dedication to Longhorns over many years. Peter's Colaba prefix is well known in the breed and Peter has also been on Council for a number of years.

The Award, a magnificent bronze made by sculptor Nicola Toms was commissioned by Mrs Pat Quinn during her time as President to be awarded by subsequent Presidents at the end of their term in office.



New Animal Transport Regulations Time is running out!

Competency Certificate

Under the new Welfare in Transport regulations anyone transporting cattle, sheep, pigs, goats, horses and poultry by road over distances of around 40 miles (65km) in connection with an economic activity will need to be assessed in their competency by 5 January 2008.

The new rules which became law in January 2007 also require handlers (including market and assembly centre staff) and transporters of all animals to be trained in the new regulation's technical rules (fitness to travel, means of transport, loading/unloading etc). How training is achieved is up to the individual. It may be achieved by means of on-the-job instruction combined with practical experience or by more formal methods leading to a qualifications. DEFRA recognise that Bluetongue and FMD have effectively prevented livestock farmers and hauliers from achieving the Certificate of Competence. On this basis it has been agreed with the enforcement authorities that no sanctions will be taken against transporters not in possession of competence certificates until the end of April 2008. This arrangement applies only to journey within the UK.

Assessment for competency is carried out be independent bodies DEFRA has designated to undertake this work. Competency certificates can only be awarded by these organisations. EBLEX have produced a list of Top 10 herd health tips' that any cattle keeper should follow to improve the health and profitability of their herd

- Form a team approach to reduce disease costs through farm health planning involve farmers, stockmen, veterinary surgeons and other advisers
- Monitor herd health status blood sample youngstock to detect what diseases are present
- Improve herd health status by culling infected animals (eg animals persistently infected with BVD or carry IBR or Johne's disease)
- Control diseases which cannot be eradicated appropriate vaccination policies will repay costs many times over
- Implement effective treatment protocols where disease cannot be completely prevented – limit damage by resolving the disease as quick and effectively as possible
- Improve management practices (eg batch calving or all-in/all-out policies
- Improve the environment (eg improve ventilation is stock buildings)
- Record reproductive performance beef production starts with the birth of live calves
- Record growth rates –find out if you are getting a return on your feed input
- Increase biosecurity don't buy in disease.
