## RULES FOR THE NATIONAL SHOW AND SALE and AUTUMN SALE

### INSPECTION PROTOCOL

Society appointed inspectors will assess bulls and females entered into the National Show & Sale for locomotion, temperament, conformation and breed characteristics to a Society standard. Pen cards will be attached to each pen showing the results of the inspection. Eartags will be checked by an official representative and must be accurate and legible.

### SPECIAL REGULATIONS & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

1. The Sale is held subject to the Regulations as printed in this notice and also to the LAA conditions of Sale and the Auctioneers General Conditions of Sale.
2. Entry to Classes 1 - 5 is open to any Full member of the Society provided their subscriptions are up to date and all stock must be fully registered or within the Society's official notification of birth time limit.
3. The Society reserve the right to inspect any cattle entered for sale to assess their suitability.
4. ALL cattle over 42 days of age must have passed a TB test within 60 days of the proposed movement irrespective of local TB testing area.
5. It is recommended that all cattle forward for sale are either in a CHeCS recognised Health Scheme or are individually tested for Leptospirosis, BVD, Johnes and IBR.
6. All entries must be made on the official entry forms (reply card enclosed) and must be completed throughout. Entries must be accompanied by the ENTRY FEE and the relevant REGISTRATION CERTIFICATES. Entries without the relevant fees and certificates will not be accepted. The Society reserves the right to refuse or restrict entries if it is felt necessary at the closing date for entries.  
ENTRY FEE £30 PER ENTRY for both National Show & Sale and Autumn Sale.
5. There will be a pre-sale inspection as detailed above.
6. There will be two sections of sale
  - a) National Show & Sale cattle
  - b) Autumn sale of unaltered, ie unled cattle

### Times of Arrival and Timetable of Events

#### **Friday 29 August**

12.00am	Market opens to receive cattle
4.00pm	Inspections commence
5.00pm	All National Show & Sale cattle must be on site by this time and be forward for inspection to be eligible to show and sell

#### **Saturday 30 August**

06.00 - 08.00am	Market open to receive Autumn Sale cattle only
09.00 am	Show commences, followed by Young Handlers
11.30 am	Sale commences
6.00pm	All cattle must be removed from site by this time

1. All cattle must be fully registered within the Society's official time limits.
2. Cows no longer suckling their calves must have been weaned at least two weeks prior to the Sale
3. Pedigree certificates and entry fees must be submitted with the completed entry form.
4. All cattle must be entered by the registered owner or their agent. Membership fees of the registered owner must be up to date.
5. The Society reserves the right to refuse or restrict entries if it is felt necessary, at the closing date for entries.
6. Cattle entered in the National Show & Sale must be halter led and subject to inspection as detailed overleaf.
7. Only animals which are entered into the National Show & Sale may also enter a pre-sale show.
8. The pre-sale show will take place in a ring. Animals must be halter-led when shown & sold.
9. The National Show & Sale will take place prior to the Autumn sale, and animals will be sold in age order with the oldest first, females followed by bulls.
10. Vendors have the right to place a reserve price on any or all of their cattle. This must be notified to the Auctioneers in writing, preferably before the commencement of the Sale and will be treated as a reserve and not a guide.
11. All transactions either by Auction or by Private Treaty following the Sale must be passed through the Auctioneer's sale office.
12. All registered cattle will be sold in guineas with a commission rate of 5%.
13. Each animal forward at the Sale must be exposed for sale by Auction before any private sale shall be permitted or recognized by the Society or the Auctioneers.
14. The vendor must present for sale by auction any animal catalogued for sale. Where animals catalogued cannot be brought forward a like for like substitution can be made up to 48 hours prior to the start of the sale. Should a substitution be made then a veterinary certificate should be submitted for the withdrawn animal and a £30.00 fee will be payable for the entry of the substitute animal.
15. Any vendor not bringing cattle for sale on the day should provide a veterinary certificate for the absent animal or will be subject to a fine of £30.00 when entering a subsequent Longhorn sales. The Society shall reserve the right to refuse entries at subsequent Longhorn sales.
16. All cattle sold will be subject to a transfer fee of £12.00 payable by both the vendor and the purchaser.
17. All sales are held subject to the Special Regulations as printed in the Sale schedule and also to the LAA Conditions of Sale and the Auctioneers General Conditions of Sale.
18. All lots will be covered by the NBA Terms & Conditions of Sale incorporating the bull breeding warranty and female breeding warranty
19. Draft consignments may be considered, to be inspected on-farm before acceptance. These cattle will be sold after the National Show & Sale and should be haltered.
20. TB testing - ALL cattle over 42 days of age must have passed a TB test within 60 days of the proposed movement irrespective of local TB testing area. Cattle coming from Wales and Scotland must abide by their respective devolved body regulations.
21. Initial straw will be provided but vendors must provide their own feed, buckets etc.. All Show & Sale cattle to be double tied.
