JUDGE: Mr Ron Hodgkinson

To be judged under the rules of the **British Charolais Cattle Society Ltd.**

All cows shown should have produced a calf naturally within the last 15 months.

No animal may be shown that has been used as an embryo transfer donor, until she has produced a calf by natural birth.

Trophy C24: The Sankey Perpetual Trophy is offered for the Champion British Charolais.

Trophy C25: The Barkby Trophy is offered for the best Charolais of the opposite sex to the Champion.

Special Award: The **East Midlands Region of the British Charolais Cattle Society** offers a Rosette, Sash and BCCS Metal Plaque for the Champion.

Class 49: **BULL**, born before the 1 January 2011.

Class 50: **BULL**, born after the 1 January 2011.

Class 51: **MAIDEN HEIFER**, born on or after 1 January 2011.

Class 52: **HEIFER**, born on or after 1 January 2010.

Class 53: **COW**, in calf or with calf at foot, born before 31 December 2009.

Class 54: **GROUP OF THREE ANIMALS**, of any sex, the property of the Exhibitor and entered in the previous Classes.

Trophy C34: The Dalgety Shield is offered for the Female Champion.

Trophy C27: The BOCM Silcock Perpetual Challenge Cup is offered for the Champion Simmental.

Trophy C28: The B.E. Kenney (W) Ltd. Perpetual Sculptured Trophy is offered for the best Cow & Calf, other than the Champion.

Special Award: The **British Simmental Cattle Society** offers Rosettes for the Champion and the Reserve Champion British Simmental.

Trophy C36: The Haddon Burditt Perpetual Trophy, kindly presented by **Mrs L Burditt**, is offered for the Best Junior Simmental animal, under two years old on the day of the Show.

Class 61: **BULL**, born before 1 January 2011.

Class 62: **BULL**, born on or after 1 January 2011.

Class 63: **HEIFER**, born on or after 1 January 2011

Class 64: **HEIFER**, born on or after 1 January 2010

Class 65: **COW IN MILK OR IN CALF, OR HEIFER IN CALF**, capable of being certified in calf at the date of the Show, and born in 2009. Heifers must have calved before the age of three years.

Class 66: **COW**, in milk or in calf, capable of being certified in calf at the date of the Show, and born before 2009.

Class 67: **CALF**, under 12 months on the date of the Show, shown on its own.

Class 68: **PAIR**, of any sex, the property of the Exhibitor and entered in the previous Classes.

BEEF - ANY OTHER BREED - CONTINENTAL

Class 69: **BULL**, of any age.

Class 70: **HEIFER**, born on or after 1 January 2011.

Class 71: **HEIFER**, born on or after 1 January 2010.

Class 72: **COW**, in milk or in calf born before 1 January 2010.

INTER-BREED GROUP

JUDGE: Mr P Doleman

Best group of three animals of any breed, comprising three females, or two females and one bull, which have competed in the breed classes from the previous day. To be picked by the breed exhibitors.

Only **one** group per breed.

DAIRY - DEXTERS

JUDGE: Mr H J Lee, Bristol

Special Award: A Breed Spoon and Rosette is offered by The **Dexter Cattle Society** for the Champion.

All cattle forward must be fully registered in The Dexter Cattle Society Herd Book.

Class 89: **HEIFER**, in milk or in calf, with first calf over 24 months.

Class 90: **COW**, in milk, with second or subsequent calf.

Class 91: **HEIFER**, under 12 months on the day of the Show.

Class 92: **HEIFER**, over 12 months and under 24 months on the day of the Show.

Class 93: **DRY COW IN CALF**.

Class 94: **BULL**, of any age.

SUPREME BEEF CHAMPIONSHIP

JUDGE: Mr P Doleman

The Hereford, Highland, Longhorn, Beef Shorthorn, British Blue, British Blonde, Aberdeen Angus, Charolais, Limousin & Simmental Breeds will automatically qualify for this Championship.

In the event of any Breed Champion animal being unable to compete for health reasons, supported by a Health Certificate, issued by one of the Society's Veterinary Surgeons, the Breed may be represented by the Reserve Champion. (Commercial cattle are not eligible)

The prizes for this Championship are: Champion, £50, a Rosette and a Sash; and Reserve Champion, £25 and a Rosette.

Trophy C1: The Oldacres Perpetual Trophy is offered for the Supreme Champion.

Trophy C2: The Foremark Plate is offered for the highest placed Native animal (Highland, Longhorn, Angus, Hereford & Any Other Beef Breed Native Breeds are eligible)

Trophy C37: The Peter Bailey Cup is offered for the Supreme Reserve Champion

Specific Rules and Regulations of the Cattle Section

The Champion & Reserve Champion for ALL Championships will be required to come forward for a Parade of Champions at 3pm (time approx.) Failure to comply will result in the forfeit of prize money. These Specific Rules and Regulations are supplementary to the General Show Rules for all Livestock Exhibitors.

Entries

Only pedigree cattle or animals entered in the appendix, grading or supplementary registers can be entered - with the exception of entries to the Commercial Cattle Classes.

Each animal's exact DOB must be given on the entry form – entries in each Class will be judged in DOB order.

Each animal's Ear Tag must be given on the entry form, because the Society is required by DEFRA to complete the statutory cattle movement records.

The last calving date must be given on the entry form.

The same animal may not be entered in both cow and heifer classes.

Only stalls booked, and paid for, will be reserved in the name of the Exhibitor. No additional space will be available at the Show. Please ensure the correct number of stalls is requested to house your animals. No entries will be accepted on the day.

Breeds with insufficient entries in their classes may be placed into the "Any Other Breed" Section, at the Cattle Committee's discretion.

Cattle may arrive from 2.30pm on Friday 24th August, but must be on site by 8.00am on Saturday. No late arrivals will be permitted. In the event of an Exhibitor being turned away because of late arrival, entry fees will not be returned.

Passports and Animal Health and Welfare

Each animal must be accompanied by its Passport, which will be checked on arrival at the Cattle Section of the Showground.

Exhibitors will be required to bring their registration certificates for inspection and may be asked to submit cows to a PH Test.

Any animal which shows evidence of calving or aborting while on exhibition must be withdrawn into isolation, and be returned home as soon as possible, together with all Show Animals from the same registered premises.

Exhibitors wishing to fence off their stalls must provide their own hurdles.

Exhibitors will be required to supply own straw.

Cattle Handling

The Health and Safety Executive has issued notes of guidance (currently Agriculture Information Sheet 35) on the subject of handling cattle and especially bulls. It is the duty of the Exhibitor and his/her staff to adhere to these.

Heifers in the beef breeds must be shown with 'bull-dogs'.

All bulls must be fitted with a nose ring. A Bull pole or rope must be attached to the nose ring and a rope or chain must be fitted to the halter.

It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to provide all handling equipment, and to ensure the fitness and training of the handler to an acceptable standard. Children are not permitted to accompany a bull while being led. In general, a handler should be over 18 years of age and under 65 years of age. All bulls must be attended at all times whilst the Show is open to the public.

All cattle must be secured to the satisfaction of the Chief Cattle Steward, who shall have the power to exclude from the Showground any unruly animal. Animals with a previous record of unruly behaviour should not be brought onto the Showground.

Entry Fees, Prize Money, Entry Wristbands and Vehicle Passes

Entry Fee: £10 per stall.

Entry to Group of Three Classes and Young Handler Classes is free of charge. Entry Forms must, however, be completed for these free of charge Classes.

Prize money for each Class, other than Group of Three Classes and Young Handler Classes, will be as follows: 1st: £30; 2nd: £20; 3rd: £10.

Group of Three Classes prize money: 1st: £10, 2nd: £5.

Each Exhibitor entering the Show will receive Vehicle Passes free of charge as follows: 1-2 animals: 1 Vehicle Pass. 1,2 or 3 animals 2 wristbands, 4,5 or 6 animals 4 wristbands.

Please note if Judges are not mentioned in the Schedule they are still **To Be Confirmed**

Trophy C33: The Lockhart Cup is offered for the Best-kept Cattle Line.

BEEF - COMMERCIAL BEEF

The prizes for each Class within this Section are: **Trophy C5:** The Leicester Fatstock Trophy is offered for the Champion.

Trophy C7: The Sir Lyonel Tollemache Salver is offered for the Champion Heifer, with a Rosette for the Reserve Champion Heifer.

Special Award: A Rosette, kindly presented by the **British Simmental Cattle Society Ltd** is offered for the highest placed animal sired by a Simmental Bull.

Class 1: BEST BUTCHER'S STEER, Limousin or Limousin Cross.

Class 2: BEST BUTCHER'S STEER, Any Other Breed, sired by a Continental Bull.

Class 3: BEST BUTCHER'S STEER, Any Other Breed, sired by a Native Bull.

Class 4: BEST BUTCHER'S HEIFER, Limousin or Limousin Cross.

Class 5: BEST BUTCHER'S HEIFER, Any Other Breed, sired by a Continental Bull.

Class 6: BEST BUTCHER'S HEIFER, Any Other Breed, sired by a Native Bull.

Special Award: The **Midlands and East Anglia Hereford Breeders' Association** offers £10 and Rosettes for the Male and Female Champions, Rosettes for the Reserve Male and Female Champions.

Special Award: HCS Rosette for the breed champion

Class 12: BULL, born after 1 March 2011.

Class 13: BULL, born between 1 September 2010 and 28 February 2011.

Class 14: BULL, born before 1 September 2010.

Class 15: HEIFER, born after 1st March 2011.

Class 16: HEIFER, born between 1 September 2010 and 28 February 2011.

Class 17: COW or HEIFER, born on or before 31 August 2010.

Class 18: PAIRS, the property of the Exhibitor and entered in the previous Classes.

Class 22: HEIFER, born in 2009.

Class 24: HEIFER, born in 2011.

Class 25: PAIR OF ANIMALS, of any age, to be exhibited by the breeder.

Trophy C31: A Challenge Cup, kindly presented by the **Midlands Blonde D'Aquitaine Club**, is offered for the Champion Blonde.

Class 44: BULL, any age.

Class 45: COW, born before 31 December 2009.

Class 47: MAIDEN HEIFER, born on or after 1 January 2011.

Class 48: GROUP OF THREE ANIMALS, of any sex, the property of the Exhibitor and entered in the previous Classes.

How to complete your entry form

- It's your personal responsibility to read the General Show Rules and the Special Rules for the Cattle Section, in the Schedule. Please read them carefully BEFORE completing this Entry Form.
- It's also your personal responsibility to check that you are entering the correct Class and, if the Class requires, are registered and qualified to do so; we do not have the time to check the entries!
- Passports MUST be brought for ALL animals.
- Every **INDIVIDUAL** entry must give the Ear Tag (**BCMS**) No. (Passports will be checked on arrival at the Show) and DOB (each Class will be judged in DOB order). Please double-check the accuracy of the BCMS No. with each animal's Passport before completing the Entry Form. **Last year, we had problems with the Cattle Movement Service on-line system, because some Exhibitors had quoted incorrect numbers.**
- For **GROUP** entries (Group of Three),

PREFERABLY give the names and other details of the animals (bracketed together with the word "Group" to make it clear that they are a Group entry)

OR, if you wish to decide the composition of the Group just before the Show, write "Group of Three" in the entry line, BUT the Group MUST be animals already entered in other Classes in that Section and already covered by the application form.
- For **HANDLER** entries, enter the Handler's name in the "Name of Animal" Column and his/her age (in years) in the "Breed" Column. If you know, at this stage, the name of the animal to be shown by the Handler, enter its name in the "Sire" Column.
- You can pay by cheque ("The Leicestershire Agricultural Society Ltd")
- If you need more lines for entries, please photocopy the entry form.
- We aim to acknowledge entries within ten days of receipt by us; if you have not received an acknowledgement by then, please contact the Show Office to check that we have received it. Please allow time for postal delays.
- The acknowledgement letter will also include Joining Instructions, vehicle passes and entry wrist bands, to save the postage involved in a second posting nearer the Show.
- Show Numbers will be issued by the Cattle Section organisers at the Showground on arrival, when Passports are produced.
- Please read OVER LEAF about Vehicle Pass and Entry Wristband Allowances.
