Nominations for Council

All Full and Associate Members of the Longhorn Cattle Society whose subscriptions are not in arrears are eligible to be nominated for Council, subject to being correctly proposed and seconded by two other fully paid up Members. Existing Trustees standing for re-election cannot be proposed or seconded by more than one existing Trustee.

Council meet 4-5 times each year, either in person at Stoneleigh Park, Stoneleigh, Warwickshire or via videoconferencing. Council are keen to ensure that geographical location does not hinder anyone's ability to be a Trustee.

Council consists of nine Trustees, each year one third of the Trustees retire, therefore a typical term is three years. Following their first term, Trustees are eligible to stand for re-election for a further term. After the second term Trustees must stand down and are able to stand again after a one year break.

Council is made up of a diverse range of members working alongside the Chairman to ensure all aspects of running the Breed Society are covered. It is the opportunity for members to get more involved in the management of their Breed Society and to ensure the Longhorn breed has a secure future.

The Society became a Charitable Incorporated Organisation in order to comply with DEFRA regulations governing Breed Societies on 5 January 2015. The Society has to abide by the rules of the Charity Commission so all Trustees must be eligible to stand for election according to sections 178 to 180 of the Charities Act 2011.
