NBA BEEF EXPO 2017

The National Beef Association's 2017 Beef Expo will be held at The NAEC, Stoneleigh Park, Warwickshire, CV8 2LG on Thursday 18th May 2017.

Bringing together the very best in British commercial and pedigree cattle, equipment, knowledge-sharing, and show classes for everyone involved in the industry, NBA Beef Expo is held at a different venue in the UK each year.

Regularly attracting international visitors and exhibitors from around UK, is the number one showcase for the British beef sector.

The farm visits this year on Wednesday 17 May are to three Midlands farms. Roger Elliott and his son Tom will be showcasing their herd of 300 British Shorthorn, South Devon and cross bred cattle, demonstrating how their system optimises forage from 1350 acres of majority rented pasture to produce quality native bred stores and replacement heifers. Visitors will also have the chance to view a selection of cattle and calves at grass before tucking into a hot beef lunch provided by the Elliott's own butcher's shop and deli.

Mike, Jane and Charlie Wills of Upper Coton Farms will be opening the gates to their immaculate finishing unit. A model arable and AFU, finishing 1300 head of high conformation Limousin type stores on home mixed TMR rations.

Finally, John Bell of Berryfields Farm and Berrystock Feeds will be promoting the benefits of an integrated beef supply chain. While walking around this impressive 2000 head finishing unit, visitors will be able to view a complete supply chain taking dairy bred calves supplied by Meadow Quality, feeding specialised UFAS accredited feeds produced by Berrystock Feeds to produce uniform finished cattle ready to be sold direct to Dunbia supplying both the Co-op and Lidl.

The Society will have a stand at the event.

COUNCIL ELECTIONS

All Full and Associate Members of the Longhorn Cattle Society whose subscriptions are not in arrears are eligible to be nominated for Council, subject to being correctly proposed and seconded by two other fully paid up Members.

Council meet 4-5 times each year, usually on the Showground at Stoneleigh and a term of office is three years. After three years Council members are eligible to stand for re-election for a further three year period. After the second three year term Council members must stand down and are able to stand again after a one year break.

Council is made up of a diverse range of members and work alongside the Secretary to ensure all aspects of running the Breed Society are covered. It is the opportunity for members to get more involved in the management of their Breed Society and to ensure the Longhorn breed has a secure future.

There will be three spaces available for Council this year, with new Trustees being elected by postal ballot during September and taking up their posts at the AGM in October. If you have never thought about standing for Council please consider it - it is very rewarding! If you fancy finding out more (with no obligation of course) please contact any Council member or the Secretary and then keep an eye out for the nomination papers that will be circulated later in the year.

PARENTAGE VERIFICATION

The purity of the Longhorn breed is one of its major selling points and Council have decided that a random selection of heifers should be DNA sampled to verify their parentage. To this end the owner of each 100th female registered, starting from 1 January 2015, will be asked to provide a hair sample of the calf and both parents.

Should the sire not be on the holding then the current owner will be asked to provide a sample if one is not already held. DNA samples of all AI bulls are already held and if the bull is dead then a sibling or close relative will be sought.

BULL REGISTRATIONS

Those members wishing to register bulls can download a registration form from the website or ring me for one - in any case please get in touch as you will need a hair sample bag for each bull being registered. The registration form, photographs and sample bag must be signed by a vet and these, along with the payment for registration must be received before the registration will be processed. Allow yourself plenty of time, especially if you are thinking of entering your bull for a show or sale and never assume the office has received the documentation!

Emailed registration forms or photos cannot be accepted as delivery cannot be guaranteed - the Society has pretty strong spam filters on the computer which sometimes do not allow big photo files through. We have had one incident this year where a member thought an email had been sent but the office had never received it so please post everything.

PLEASE NOTE THAT FROM 1 JANUARY 2016 BULL REGISTRATION FORMS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE OFFICE NO LATER THAN ONE MONTH FROM THE TIME THE ANIMAL WAS WEIGHED, OR REWEIGHING WILL BE REQUIRED

Frome Show (9 September 2017)

Frome Show is not holding cattle classes this year

Newbury Show (16/17 September 2017)

For those exhibitors now unable to show at Frome, Newbury Show have said they will reinstate the Longhorn classes should there be a minimum of eight entries from four exhibitors. Competitors should enter the Beef AOB classes in the first instance and then the Longhorn classes will be split out should there be sufficient entries.

Triple Crown Competition

Three agricultural shows in the Midlands are joining forces to stage a new 'Triple Crown' competition for showing cattle. Hanbury Show, Burwarton Show and Moreton in Marsh Show will award the Three Shires Trophy to the exhibitor gaining the most points across the three shows. More information is on the Society website.

Lincolnshire Show (21/22 June 2017)

The Lincolnshire Show is the Society's National Show this year and we will be holding a lunch reception after the judging. An experimental disbudded Longhorn class is being held for the first time which will be open to steers, bulls and any age females which have been disbudded. The cattle must be registered (bulls and females) or notified (steers) to the Society in accordance with current registration regulations. There is no entry fee and the winner does not qualify for any Championships. Cattle forward cannot be entered into any of the other Longhorn classes but must be entered in advance of the Show for penning purposes. Schedules are on the Society website and contact details are in the enclosed leaflet

TB COMPENSATION

Whilst the eradication of Bovine TB should be at the forefront of DEFRA's minds, it's inexorable creep across the country means more and more members are being affected. A quick look at the difference between the compensation you will receive for a registered pedigree animal and a non pedigree animal might make registration of all your calves a consideration. Retrospective pedigree registration of TB reactors is not permitted.

The table shows compensation for March 2017 It is updated each month.

The table is applicable to England only - Wales and Northern Ireland are on individual valuation and Scotland is TB free.
