AGM 14 OCTOBER 2017

At the AGM on Saturday 14 October members of the Society voted to change one of the General Rules of the Society thus:

'Disbudded cows, heifers or bulls are eligible to compete in show classes for breeding cattle. Only fully registered animals will be eligible to compete in show classes for breeding cattle. Disbudded cattle may be shown at Society sales.'

This rule change means that disbudded cattle are now allowed in the show ring and of course can be entered at Society sales.

This press release was sent out to the agricultural press:

At the AGM on Saturday 14 October members of the Longhorn Cattle Society voted to change their general rules to allow disbudded cattle to show alongside their horned counterparts at shows with Longhorn classes. Disbudded cattle are already allowed at Society sales with show classes.

Commenting on the rule change, Bernard Llewellyn, the Society's Chairman said, 'This decision is a great step forward for the breed. It will allow members who wish to disbud their heifer calves as well as their male calves the flexibility to choose their best animals to enter into shows which are a major shop window for the breed and either keep them in their own herds, or sell top quality cattle to other suckler herds where they will be a huge asset.'

The ongoing effect of this rule change will also have benefits when it comes to the end of an animal's life as it is getting harder for abattoirs to take horned cattle – especially mature cows – and animal welfare was another factor that was taken into consideration when members voted in favour of the proposal.

I am however confident that many of us who exhibit cattle will not deprive showgoers the pleasure of observing Longhorns in their natural state, horns and all, for many years to come'

AGM WEEKEND 14 & 15 OCTOBER

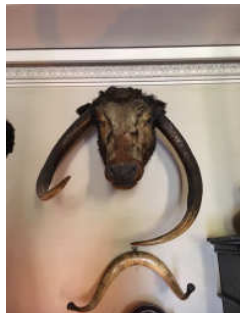
This year the Society's AGM was based in Derbyshire, with visits to Mike and Yvonne Smith's Hennisfield herd, Ben and Tori Stanley's Melbourne Park herd and Calke Abbey. Around 80 members joined in all or part of the weekend's activities. A full report is on the Society's blog and will be in the next Journal.

Saturday 14 October

The weekend started with a visit to the breeding section of the Hennisfield herd belonging to Mike and Yvonne Smith. Mike and Yvonne bought Hennisfield Farm in 2003, initially rearing free range poultry and sheep. They bought two cows and calves from the Blackbrook/Fishwick/Southfield sale in 2007 to start their Longhorn herd and five years ago gave up free range egg production. The sheep enterprise has also been reduced so all efforts are now concentrated on the Longhorns. The herd now comprises 20 cows and followers, with heifers being retained as replacements and steers being finished for local butchers shops.



The herd has had success in both the show and sale ring. We didn't have far to go to see the cattle as they were running in the parkland adjacent to the Hilton Hotel, our base for the weekend.



The formal AGM business was conducted with a change to the General Rules being voted in (see page 4) and David Blockley and Paul Ashcroft being re-elected back onto Council.

After lunch a number of members visited Calke Abbey which has been home to Longhorn cattle since the 18th Century. As well as cattle grazing in the park there are a number of Longhorn heads in the Entrance Hall to greet visitors.

In the evening we had a meal at the Hilton Hotel and along with a raffle we were entertained by our outgoing President, Dr Phil Cleland.

AGM WEEKEND 14 & 15 OCTOBER

Sunday 15 October

On Sunday the day was spent at the various enterprises of Ben and Tori Stanley of the Melbourne Park herd. Ben and Tori recently secured the long term tenancy on Park Farm, part of the Melbourne Hall Estate and they also farm land nearby at Langley Abbey Priory. As well as the Longhorn herd there are also flocks of Jacob and Texel sheep, and a flock of Portlands managed by Tori and Ben on behalf of



Lady Ralph Kerr. The Longhorn cattle are taken through to finishing and sold through their own butcher's shop at King's Newton as well as farmers markets, local farm shops and butchers.

Tori and Ben won the Farmer's Guardian Awards 'Beef Innovator of the Year' award in 2016.

We started off at Tori and Ben's Butchery in King's Newton which had only had it's official opening the week before for coffee and a butchery demonstration which proved a real hit.



From there we moved on to Park Farm to see the breeding cattle and the finishing cattle. We were then treated to an amazing Longhorn lunch, with Longhorn cooked 'from nose to tail' by 2014 BBC Masterchef Winner Sven Britt-Hansen and his team. We had dishes of Longhorn neck, Longhorn brisket, Longhorn sirloin, Longhorn forerib, Longhorn rump and Longhorn oxtail. This was all washed down with two beers that had been brewed specially for the occasion – Melbourne Park and Herbertsherd.

Leebarn Perpetual Trophy – Cow of the Year

28 registered cows were shown this year. In third place with nine points was Chalkney Tempo from Mr S Dixon In second place was Tetford Twinkle from Mr & Mrs CTD Sutcliffe. In first place with 15 points was Gorse Valentine Rose from Mrs V Hopkinson.

Lesley Hutton Perpetual Trophy – Heifer of the Year

70 registered heifers were shown this year. In third place with 25 points was Dunstall Peony from Mrs EM Hallfield, in 2nd place with 28 points was Pointer Caci from Mr D Howden. In first place with 32 points was Carreg Quicksilver from Mr & Mrs B&M Wheeler.

Paul Luckett Memorial Trophy

Three members had shown Longhorn cattle in their own right for the first time in 2017. Yvonne Ferguson and Harry Saxby tied for second place and in first place was Bertie Stanley.

Frank Sutton Young Handlers Competition

Four Junior members had taken part in stockjudging competitions this year. In fourth place was Dan Preece, in third place was Coby Horrocks, in second place was Rhiannydd Davies, and in first place was William Edwards.

President's Award

The President's Award, given by the retiring President to a member of the Society whom they feel has made a significant contribution to the breed either recently or in the past, was awarded by Dr Phil Cleland to Charles and Angela Cottrell-Dormer of the Rousham herd. The Cottrell-Dormers were amongst those who kept Longhorns during the 'lean' times and the President felt their unwavering support of the breed should be recognised.

140TH ANNIVERSARY HERDBOOK

In 2018 the Society celebrates the 140th Anniversary of the publication of the first Herdbook and therefore the formalisation of the breed. In order to recognise this, it is proposed that a facsimile edition of the first Herdbook be produced. It will look and feel as close as it is possible to get to how it would have been when it was first printed in 1878. It is understood that there are only five original Herdbooks in existence! The cost of the facsimile Herdbook will be dependent on the number ordered by members but it is hoped the cost can be kept below £25.

A list of breeders (76 in total)

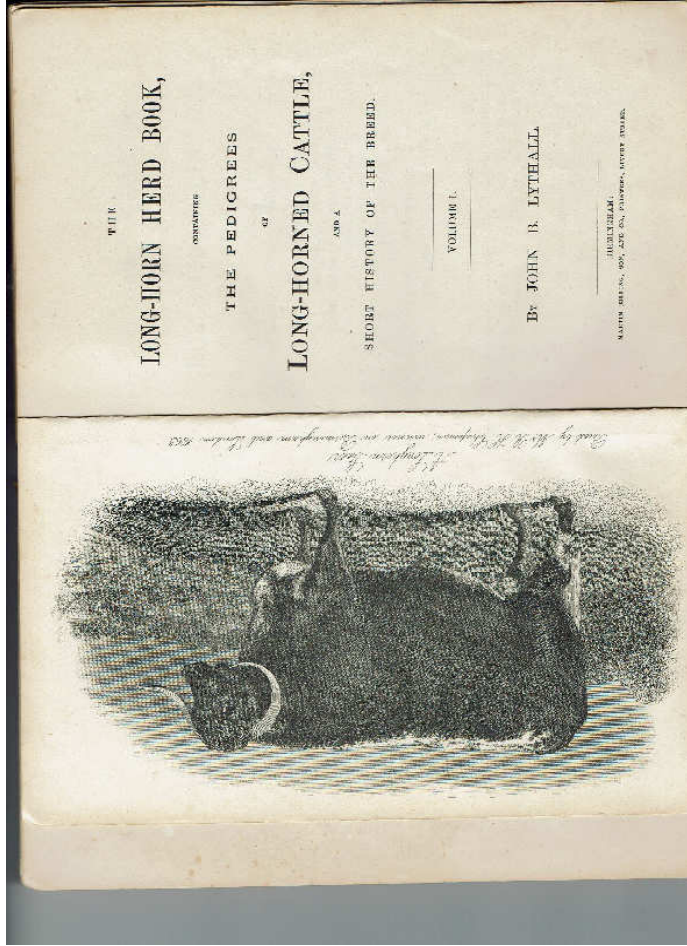

The next important event in Long-horn animals to which allusion must be made is the dispersion of Mr. R. H. Chapman's herd at Upton in 1876. Founded as early as 1759 by Mr. George Chapman, and carefully bred from that date from the very best strains of blood that could be procured, they deservedly took rank as one of the best, as well as oldest, herds in existence; and with the remembrance of the good qualities inherent in the breed, many went there as mechanics to lay the foundation of future herds. That such very thoroughbred blood should be looked upon as a fresh starting point from which the history of the breed will be traced. It is well known that similarity of characterisation in cattle always denotes purity of race, and careful selections of a recognised type during a long course of years, is the only way to secure this greatly desired effect. Like the Durockow Boreas, mentioned in a former part of this article (and no doubt guided by the same principles), the Chapman family succeeded in breeding "a dairy of Long-horn cows, alike in colour and shape," for the 51 offered at Upton showed a remarkable likeness to each other, all possessing the orthodox white back and other characteristics. "A gentleman who takes much delight in breeding, but who had never seen Long-horns before, was attracted to the Upton sale, and after examining them, said, "This is indeed a beautiful sight." This sale was not only a great success, but it took almost the character of a farewell fête, given by persons of all degrees, to their old friend and neighbour, Mr. Chapman, who was about to remove to St. Asaph, in North Wales. The late Earl Howe took the chair, and Mr. J. H. Burbury the vice-chair, and nearly every owner of Long-horns in the country was either present himself, or in some way represented there. When Messrs. Lythall and Clark came to run up an average of £33 per head had been reached, including those animals sold to the butcher. Our two-year-old heifer realised 50 guineas, and 14 of that age averaged £60 15s. 3d. The yearlings and calves were reserved,

and subsequently sold as two-year-olds during the Birmingham Show weeks of the following years 1874 and 1875. In 1874 the 12 reached an average of nearly £37; and the grand "Headed Beauty"—quite the star of the lot, at most beautiful before—went, to Mr. Towler Baker's bid, at £97 10s. In 1875, though the lot was on the whole more even, and in better condition, the average was a little less, being £34 15s. for 15 of them; but there was no "Headed Beauty" there to enthrall the rest, and "Upton's Last Link" headed the bill with £49 7s. The 78 Long-horns Mr. Chapman sold in two years averaged £34, and 7 of the two-year-old heifers averaged £50 14s. These averages compare very well with a large proportion of the Short-horn sales held from January to November, in 1875, as out of 139, 56 were either below them, or the same price as nearly as possible; so that, considering the comparatively small number of Long-horn buyers, they have very fairly held their own in the sale ring as well as in the show yard.

On April 14, 1874, Mr. Weston of Withers, Warwickshire, sold off his herd, when W. T. Cox, Esq., Mr. R. Hull, and Mr. Frederick Tomkinson were large purchasers, the latter securing the bull "Popping Tom," which obtained 2nd prize at the Royal at Birmingham in 1876. The animals were all in quite ordinary store condition, and ranged from 20 to 50 guineas each, and those re-sold at Spendon with their produce made more than double these figures.

Next comes the sale of Mr. Brown's herd at Perwell, in March, 1876. Thus, although of undeniably pure blood, did not make so good an average as Mr. Chapman's, as Mr. Brown of late years had neglected colour, and bred them entirely for dairy purposes, without regard to other qualities; but, as before stated, in former years the herd won several prizes, and

GENUS CHARGES

For members of the Society that use semen from Society stocks please note that Genus levy distribution charges to the Society. The Society passes these charges on at cost.

There is a distribution charge of £3 per straw, with a minimum transaction charge of £25 and a maximum of £500 per transaction. This means if you order one straw you will be charged £25 to transfer it. This is to both Genus technicians and DIY flasks. The charge to third parties (ie your local technician who is not Genus) is £80 for 1 to 20 straws and £80 + £3 per straw (capped at £500) for over 20 straws. All these prices will have VAT at 20% added to them. These charges are in addition to the cost of the semen itself.

SLAUGHTER WEIGHTS NEEDED

As always the Society is real need of information to provide to potential members, butchers, finishers and consumers. If you take animals through to finishing can you think about the Society and drop the office an email with the eartag number of the animal, it's date of birth and it's slaughter weight. Even better still, notify the death using the online Herdbook and put the slaughter weight in the 'details' field. If you have a EUROP grid grade that would also be really helpful. Thank you!

SOCIETY SALES

Council want you to get the best price for your cattle at Society sales and be happy with what you have put forward to represent your herd and the breed.

When assessing your cattle for potential entry to Society sales please consider if they will be in a condition that will reflect well on you as a vendor as well as the breed in general. If in doubt please ask Debbie to arrange for a Council member to visit who will be able to advise you.

Council reserves the right to inspect any cattle entered for Society sales to assess their suitability.

TB testing is compulsory for all cattle entered in Society sales

SALE PURCHASERS AND PRICES

The Midgham Herd belonging to Mr & Mrs Hedges was recently dispersed at Cirencester Market. The Yaverland herd, owned by Dr D Buckeridge and managed by Helen and Malcolm Painter recently had a production sale at Worcester Market. The purchasers and prices for both sales are on the website.

PARENTAGE VERIFICATION

The purity of the Longhorn breed is one of it's major selling points and Council have decided that a random selection of heifers should be DNA sampled to verify their parentage. To this end the owner of each 100th female registered, starting from 1 January 2015, will be asked to provide a hair sample of the calf and both parents.

Should the sire not be on the holding then the current owner will be asked to provide a sample if one is not already held. DNA samples of all AI bulls are already held and if the bull is dead then a sibling or close relative will be sought.

ONLINE HERDBOOK SECURITY

As you will all be aware there have been a lot of international problems associated with cyber security in recent months. This has focused attention on additional web based security tools. As a result Grassroots Systems Ltd who provide our 'Pedeweb' on line flock/herd book facility have moved to a more secure **https system**.

In order to make sure you are using this new facility, you may need to clear your browsing data. When you log into Pedeweb you can see in the box at the top of the screen if you are on an **http** version or an **https** version of the site.

Transfer fees are payable on breeding females and registered bulls by both buyer and seller unless an alternative arrangement is made between both parties

BULL REGISTRATIONS

Those members wishing to register bulls can download a registration form from the website or ring the office for one - in any case please get in touch as you will need a hair sample bag for each bull being registered. The registration form, photographs and sample bag must be signed by a vet and these, along with the payment for registration must be received before the registration will be processed. Allow yourself plenty of time, especially if you are thinking of entering your bull for a show or sale and never assume the office has received the documentation!

Emailed registration forms or photos can be accepted as long as you contact the office first - the Society has pretty strong spam filters on the computer which sometimes does not allow big photo files through. We have had an incident where a member thought an email had been sent but the office had never received it so please let the office know in advance that you are emailing pictures. Hair samples must be posted.

PLEASE NOTE THAT FROM 1 JANUARY 2016 BULL REGISTRATION FORMS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE OFFICE NO LATER THAN ONE MONTH FROM THE TIME THE ANIMAL WAS WEIGHED, OR RE-WEIGHING WILL BE REQUIRED

BEEF CERTIFICATES

Beef certificates are £6. They are proof that your finishing animal is a pure-bred Longhorn should you need to offer such proof to a butcher, finisher, meat marketing scheme or restaurant. You can buy them when you notify your male calves by clicking on the 'with beef cert' option or if you decide you need one when your animal is finished

TYPE CLASSIFICATION

Following in the footsteps of breeds such as the Dexters, Beef Shorthorns and now the Simmentals the Society has been running it's type classification scheme for nearly a year now.

Longhorn breeders have made huge strides in the last 20 or so years to improve their cattle through careful and selective breeding. Type classification provides an independent assessment of members' cattle in order to identify strengths and weaknesses within the herd and speed up breed improvement.

Type classification is also an excellent independent guide for new members who will be able to select cattle that have been assessed when establishing a herd if they wish.

Cattle are assessed by classifiers from Holstein UK who have been specially trained to classify beef cattle. Assessed on 14 different linear traits that make up four composite traits, a final score results in a grade from 'poor' to 'excellent'. This grade is then appended to the animal's pedigree so anyone can see how an animal has been independently assessed. As the scheme develops multiple generations of cattle will be inspected and the results will inform members which cattle they should retain in their herd to improve the quality of both their herd and the national population.

The breeders that have had their animals classified so far this year have all reported that the process has been straightforward and very positive. These members, and a list of the cattle that have graded VG (Very Good) and EX (Excellent) are in the Knowledgebase on the website. See the link below.

TB COMPENSATION

Whilst the eradication of Bovine TB should be at the forefront of DEFRA's minds, it's inexorable creep across the country means more and more members are being affected. A quick look at the difference between the compensation you will receive for a registered pedigree animal and a non pedigree animal might make registration of all your calves a consideration. Retrospective pedigree registration of TB reactors is not permitted.

The table shows compensation for November 2017. It is updated each month.

The table is applicable to England only - Wales and Northern Ireland are on individual valuation and Scotland is TB free.
